# Education with special focus on Girl children education

- 40 girls currently undergoing 2 years coaching for IIT JEE
- 79 girls provided with lodging and boarding support to continue their school education
- Mentoring to students studying in Tier 2 and Tier 3 colleges

# Water management

- 23,21,010 liters of water harvested annually from all the Rain water Harvesting units constructed in Orohalli panchayath
- Approximately Annualy Rs -3,86,000 saved on water expenses for community
- 100% access to Drinking water and Toilets the anganwadis of Orohalli and Jadigenahalli panchayath
- 100% access to Drinking water and Toilets the govt schools of Orohalli and Jadigenahalli panchayath
- 100% households with piped water connection and platform
- 100% coverage in govt schools regarding awareness
- A model village was created with rain water conservation at household level and community level
- Convergence at panchayath level for developing collaborative village action plan for holistic development of villages
- 14 schools provided with hand wash facilities
- 12 Anganwadis provided with hand wash facilities
- Reclaimed a lake and pond

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# Environment and Sustainable development

- Solid Waste management efforts in 30 Gram Panchayats of Kolar district touching 45,629 households
- Food forest created with 10,818 fruit trees plant on 44acres of land
- 400 plus women transitioned to sustainable menstrual hygiene practices and provided with materials
- All the CSR events are made single use plastic free
- Farmers trained on natural farming and achieved 20% reduction in input cost and 30% increase in produces
- Rain water harvesting models created in 4 public places
   and enabled 65 households to build RWH structures
- WASH awareness to children in all schools


